



Our Stunning God is Faithful

The Fear of the Future: How many times have you worried about the future—your wellbeing, your parents, your children, your school, your business, your relationships?

Question: What does it mean that “God is faithful?”

So What? How should we live differently if God really is faithful?

God is faithful—unfailing in His love, commitment, help, and truthfulness.

- The evidence:
- God’s faithfulness is based in His inner, unchanging character or nature.

So What?

First, He can be trusted to give us salvation through faith in Christ.

Second, He can be trusted to keep us saved through His Own will and power.

Third, He can be trusted for today’s needs.

Fourth, He can be trusted for tomorrow’s needs.

Fifth, He expects us to be faithful.

Key Truth: Our stunning God is faithful...therefore today is secure and tomorrow is secure and we must be faithful too.

- “Secure” does not mean “happy, healthy, wealthy, famous, pretty, and at ease.” “Secure” means “God is present and helping us in good days and bad days—providing what we need, doing what He said, and showing up where He said.”
- Please understand that we too must be present and helping and truthful in good days and bad days—providing what others need and doing what we said.

“Walking Papers”

Practical helps for walking the Christian walk each day this week.

Key Truth: Our stunning God is faithful...therefore today is secure and tomorrow is secure and we must be faithful too.

First, will you please commit to the 300 second challenge each day? You can download a reflection journal under “resources” from www.cypressbible.org.

“The 300 Second Challenge”: For 300 seconds every day will you commit to pursue God through reflection and prayer around this question:

“Father what are You saying to me and where are You leading me?”

Please take some time each day this week to think through these questions and ideas. A spiritual journal would be an excellent way to record your thoughts and prayers:

- **Today.** God is faithful—unfailing in His love, commitment, help, and truthfulness. What does it mean for you? Have you experienced this?
- **Monday.** God’s unfailing love is based in the unchanging character or nature of God. Please reflect on this truth for your life.
- **Tuesday.** “Secure” does not mean “happy, healthy, wealthy, famous, pretty, and at ease.” How have you defined “security” for yourself.
- **Wednesday.** “Secure” means “God is present and helping us in good days and bad days—providing what we need.” How does the American culture define “needs?” How does the Bible define “needs?”
- **Thursday.** God can be trusted for today’s needs. Why does Jesus teach us to ask for our “daily” bread? What does He mean by “daily?”
- **Friday.** God can be trusted for tomorrow’s needs. What is the evidence for that statement in your life?
- **Saturday.** God expects us to be faithful. In what areas of your life do you need greater faithfulness? What will you do to increase your faithfulness?
