



# Jaw Dropping!

Celebrating God with *Humility*. God is *Holy* and *Glorious*.  
Isaiah 6

**Listen!** What is the true holy mountain in the world?

**Isaiah recognized that God is holy and glorious. (vv 1-4)**

- *To be holy is to be absolutely and utterly unique, to be the only One.*
- *To be glorious is to be full of splendor, majesty, honor, and high status.*
- **Key Truth:** *God is the only Being in all of existence of His kind.*

**Isaiah related to God with humble confession. (vv 5-7)**

- Isaiah saw and felt the evil of his own sin before the holy God.
- **Key Truth:** *It is the spiritually despairing people who know great happiness.*
- **Key Truth:** *It is only God Who makes atonement for sin. Jesus rescues!*

**Isaiah responded to God with willing obedience. (v 8)**

- God called for a messenger and Isaiah jumped at the chance to go for God.
- **Key Truth:** *It is gratitude for forgiveness that motivates service.*

**The Core Truth of Isaiah 6:** When I see clearly the holiness and glory of God...my response is confession and service.

When I am unwilling to serve I have not seen God as He is.

- **Today. Please read:** Isaiah 6. What is the impact of the presence of God in the temple and in the life of Isaiah in this scene? What is your response to this scene?
- **Monday. Please read:** Isaiah 6. The angels declare in Isaiah 6 that God is “qadosh” which means that He is “holy, sacred, separate and set apart from all that is impure or common, utterly pure in all moral qualities, possessing divine qualities, free from all defilement and uncleanness, singled out as unique, awe inspiring, to be treated with caution, and utterly unique among all beings in all of existence now or ever.” In short, there is no one like God. What does this mean for you in your life and in your responses to God?
- **Tuesday. Please read:** Isaiah 6. The angels declare in Isaiah 6 that God is “kabod” which means that He is “glorious, majestic, full of honor and riches and splendor, of high status, and a Being of great substance or importance.” What does this mean for you in your life and in your responses to God?
- **Wednesday. Please read:** Isaiah 6 and Luke 18:9-14 and Matthew 5:3, 4. What is the common message of these passages? What does it mean for your life now?
- **Thursday. Please read:** Isaiah 6. Isaiah experienced cleansing. Who cleansed him and how was it done? What does this mean for our own cleansing? What are the New Testament passages that relate to our cleansing by God?
- **Friday. Please read:** Isaiah 6. After the vision of God and the cleansing by God Isaiah responded to God with willing service. What does that mean for your life?
- **Saturday. Please read:** Gen 32:24-32 in preparation for tomorrow’s message.
